Student Grade AppealStudents shall have protection through orderly procedures against prejudices or capricious academic evaluation. A student who believes that he or she has not been held to realistic academic standards, just evaluation procedures, or appropriate grading, may appeal the <u>final</u> grade given in the course by using the student grade appeal process described in the Academic Catalog.
